President's Message

Welcome to our first newsletter of 2024. It may seem later than usual, but the MAGA Executive has already met three times and there are a huge number of exciting plans that will get underway this year including seminars, arranging masterclasses and some changes to the annual competition after some great feedback from our members.

Whilst our industry still battles the pros and cons of music streaming and now the risks of Artificial Intelligence it seems that our elected representatives are letting the arts run down by continually reducing funding to the bodies that keep our industry vibrant including our orchestras, music schools and even music classes in schools.

The latest example is the Melbourne Youth Orchestra, which last year featured a brilliant concert of the music of Kutcha Edwards featuring arrangements by MAGA vice president Jessica Wells, Exec member Matt Amy and Patron Sean O'Boyle. The orchestra has provided training and opportunities to musicians and aspiring musicians for over 60 years but this year its minimal state government grant was cut. This is but one example of our elected representatives, the people whose job is to represent us, not seeing the importance of the arts.

Given each of our cultural institutions have emerged from the pandemic era with reduced staff, particularly music staff, and lower funding, it is certainly time for each of us to do what we can to remind our elected representatives that music and the arts is a fundamental ingredient of a modern civilised society by penning a heartfelt letter, contacting them by email or simply just signing an on line petition.

Anything each of us can do to put the continued funding of the Arts front and centre in the minds of the political class is important to ensure our industry remains the active, vital and essential part of Australian life that it has always been.



New MAGA Members

#711 David Forrest

David Forrest is a Professor of Clarinet with an extensive performing background as a soloist, recital artist, orchestrator, conductor and teacher.

Following graduation as Musician 1st Class from the Royal Marines School of Music and being appointed to the prestigious Plymouth Group Royal Marine Band, he enrolled at Trinity College of Music London on a five-year Performers Course during which, becoming a soloist for the College he was privileged in his final two years to extend his instrumental studies with the internationally renowned clarinet virtuoso, Gervais de Peyer.

As a certificated and qualified music educator he has taught across the spectrum of Primary, Middle and Senior Secondary School curricula including teaching the International Baccalaureate and Theory of Knowledge at both prestigious national and international schools around the world including The Vienna International School, Austria, The Regents School Bangkok, The English International School Prague and Aloha International School Marbella, Spain amongst others.

Having previously worked as a clarinettist with London orchestras (LPO, RPO, BBC Symphony), then the Sydney Symphony after moving to Australia in 1968, following accreditation with the ABC in 1980 as an orchestral/Opera conductor he established The Orana Opera Trust in Mudgee NSW, subsequently conducting operas Cavalleria Rusticana and 'I Pagliacci' using the ABC Sinfonia, singers from the local area and principals from the Australian Opera.

Appointed Director of Music at Ballarat and Queens Anglican Grammar School he conducted the combined Melbourne Symphony and BQAGS Orchestra for two Con-Celebrated Eucharists for the Archbishop of Canterbury on his visit to Australia, music for which included a complete performance of Haydn's Missa in Angustiis (the 'Nelson' Mass) performed by the school's 120 strong choir and soloists from The Australian Opera, following which, as Lecturer in Music Theatre at Ballarat University he founded the Ballarat Symphony Orchestra and also conducted the Tasmanian Youth Orchestra.

#712 Maeve Lander

Software engineer by day, trumpeter by night! Originally trained in the classical music tradition, I spent 6 years in the Australian Army Band, before diving into jazz and contemporary music performance. In my spare time I love to compose and arrange, specialising in music for Brass. I'm a top rated arranger for Brass on Musescore.com, with my scores being sold/downloaded around 50,000 times on that platform. I contribute to the Musescore opensource notation software, and maintain Orpheus, which is a popular sheet music reader app for Android.

#713 Alex Palmer

Alex is a composer, arranger/orchestrator, conductor and musical director for film, television, theatre and the concert hall. Based between London and Sydney, Alex trained as a cellist, pianist and singer. He holds a degree in music from the University of Cambridge and a Master's Degree in Scoring for Film, Television & Video Games from Berklee College of Music.

As an arranger and orchestrator he has worked for the Australian Brandenburg Orchestra, Sydney Symphony Orchestra, Australian Youth Orchestra, West Australian Symphony Orchestra, Sydney Youth Orchestra, and others. Alex has also worked in the music department with composers including Patrick Doyle, Lorne Balfe, Mark Mothersbaugh, Chris Willis, and Stephen Schwartz.

- 1) The release in January of my orchestral work **GENTLE SUMMER RAIN** recorded by the Moravian Philharmonic Orchestra for Symphonic Chronicles Vol.2 on the Navona Label (nv6584) The album was CD of the week on Fine Music in early January and my piece has aired both on Fine Music and more recently on ABC Classic.
- 2) I have composed a new orchestral work title FIESTA DE LA LUZ (Festival of Light) commissioned by the Beecroft Orchestra to celebrate Dr Joanna Drimatis' 10 year anniversary as conductor of the orchestra. The work will be performed in September this year. Concert title 'From Brandman to Sibelius'
- 3) I have also just completed a three-movement work **SILVER WINDS** for flute and piano commissioned by UK based flautist Mark Underwood. Mark intends to come to Australia in November and together we will present the premiere performance.
- 4) My LA VIDA APASIONADA suite of 8 Latin-American inspired works for violin and piano, based on the ensemble versions commissioned by Violinist Vov Dylan for his Palace orchestra, is now released and several tracks have been airing on ABC Classic in the past few weeks. The book of scores and parts for the LA VIDA APASIONADA suite, has just been published.

Certificate Member Santrix Redston joined after taking part in the National Youth Arranging Competition and has already achieved so much through our Mentorship Program. Well done Santrix! And big thanks to Graham Lloyd for providing the mentorship!

On the 27th of March, Top Class Sound will be held at Darebin Arts Centre, Melbourne. Top Class sound showcases the highest scoring VCE music composition/creation students of the previous academic year, and I was fortunate enough to receive an invitation to feature.

As you may know, in 2021 I became a Certificate of Merit Member after my submission to the Youth Arranging Competition. This was particularly exciting for me, then 14, because after muddling about with composing independently I was able to connect with a mentor, Graham Lloyd, who showed me how much more room I had to grow and encouraged me to keep composing.

The resources MAGA has provided inspired me to accelerate VCE Music Style and Composition (the year 12 Music composition subject in Victoria) and complete it a year early in 2023. Excitingly, my final composition folio "Untethered" - a 5 minute piece for full orchestra - was awarded 100/100 by both examiners.


Given the large scale and difficulty of the piece I wrote, I am grateful to be showcased in Top Class. I've worked closely with the manager, Amy Holley, to organise the performance which will consist of a playing of high quality VST audio of "Untethered" followed by myself and Hoang Pham playing a piano 4-hands reduction of the piece I arranged myself.

I am proud to share this story because I want MAGA members to know how much difference they can make to a student's life by being their mentor, and the value of having youth competitions and zoom events which add so much to networking and education.

Next year, I would love to go on and study composition at university.

PERTH ICON MACE FRANCIS RELEASES 10TH ALBUM WITH HIS LONG-STANDING ORCHESTRA



From big band jazz to funk, rock, noise guitar, ambient sounds, and dark country influences, you'll hear it all on the new contemporary jazz album 'No Postcode' - the fourth studio album (and 10th album release) from the Mace Francis Orchestra (MFO) out on April 12th.

Perth icon Dr Mace Francis is no stranger to Australia's jazz community. Artistic Director of the Perth International Jazz Festival and WA Youth Jazz Orchestra, current Churchill Fellow, and composer and band leader of projects including Mace Francis Plus 11 and New York Nonet - but it's with the MFO, where you'll hear the true Mace Francis best.

"It's so nice to be able to write music that is me, rather than having to bend the music into a style," says Mace.

"MFO is my main creative vehicle where I can really express what I'm feeling or thinking at the time of composing - more so than in any other band."

Mace started the band in 2004 to experiment with big band composition after graduating from university and the project continues 20 years on. It's featured a long list of up to 13 revolving musicians, with five original members remaining including Ricki Malet (trumpet), Ben Collins (saxophone), Mark Sprogowski (saxophone), Catherine Noblet (trombone) and Greg Brenton (drums).

Over the years, MFO have toured and recorded regularly achieving four national tours, performances with international jazz artists including Jim Pugh (USA), Jon Gordon (USA), John Hollenbeck (GER/USA), Satoko Fujii (JAP), Natsuki Tamura (JAP), Theo Bleckmann (USA) and Ed Partyka (Austria), released four studio albums and 10 albums, and commissioned 30 new pieces.

'No Postcode' by Mace Francis Orchestra will be released digitally and on CD and LP on 12th April 2024. The album is being launched on Saturday 13th April at The Ellington Jazz Club, Perth.


